






### **Preservation Pails**

"These are handy, portable, and are the essentials to get recovery efforts started. Everyone needs a jump start once in a while. These Preservation Pails are just that, a jump start for our collection recovery and by spreading them out, our small effort will make a big difference."

#### MACREN Memo

Mountain Area Cultural Resources Emergency Network, (MACREN) members recently participated in Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training. Here are a few highlights that can be applied to collections and hazard mitigation:

#### Use LIES when considering chemical storage:

Isolate Eliminate Separate

This applies to cleaners, maintenance areas with paint, thinners etc. Be sure to be mindful of the types of chemicals your museum is storing and if there could be potential issues due to quantities or mixing etc.

#### Four Phases of a Disaster:

Impact, Inventory, Rescue, and Recovery. These phase are not finite, you are constantly revisiting them as the disaster progresses or as you regroup after an emergency to your collections to assess the situation, what worked, what didn't and how you can change the rescue and recovery strategy for the next

#### 9 Step Size-up

These steps were designed for search and rescue missions, but in emergencies we sometimes have to do our own sort of search and rescue and the steps are applicable: Gather Facts - What happened,

- what's involved, how large etc. Assess Damage- How bad is it.
- is the building safe etc. there be electrical issues, flood-
- ing or could another round of storms come through etc.
- and your family safe, do you have the right gear to get into your building etc. Establish Priorities - what needs
- to be done first, where are the most critical areas etc. Make Decisions - who needs to be notified, where are you going
- to set up etc. Develop an Action Plan- We'll start on vault 1 or gallery 4 etc.
- Take Action- This team will check out the 2nd floor and report damage, this team will pack up the books etc.
- valuation Progress- 2 rooms cleared, this is working, this isn't and then make adjustments
